Executive VP of Law Enforcement Training

VWS's Executive Vice President of Law Enforcement Training, David Bejarano, has led a life of public service, beginning at a young age when he volunteered to serve our country as a United States Marine. It was in the Marines where he began developing his leadership skills, but more importantly, it was in this capacity where he made a personal commitment to spend his life serving the community through continuous public service.

In 1979, Mr. Bejarano joined the San Diego Police Department as a sworn officer. For more than two decades, Mr. Bejarano served and protected the City of San Diego and its residents, dutifully and honorably. In 1999, he was appointed as the City's 34th Chief of Police. As San Diego's Police Chief, Mr. Bejarano provided distinguished and recognized leadership for more than 2,000 sworn officers, 700 civilian support personnel and 1,000 police volunteers. He was responsible for an annual budget of \$262 million and for providing nationally recognized police services for over 1.3 million persons.

In 2003, Mr. Bejarano was appointed by the President of the United States and confirmed by the United States Senate as the United States Marshal for the Southern District of California. During his tenure, Mr. Bejarano was appointed to Chair a Federal Narcotics Enforcement Initiative focusing on the California, Arizona, New Mexico, and Texas borders. This leadership role provided him with a unique perspective on drug trafficking enforcement efforts facing our county and country.

In 2009, Mr. Bejarano was sworn in as the City of Chula Vista's 23rd Chief of Police. Chief Bejarano leads a department of 240 sworn law officers and 90 civilian employees, plus more than a hundred volunteers. He oversees a budget of 44 million dollars and provides law enforcement services to a community of 225,000 people. Chula Vista, California is the second largest city in San Diego County, 14th largest in the state and the 89th largest in the country.
